

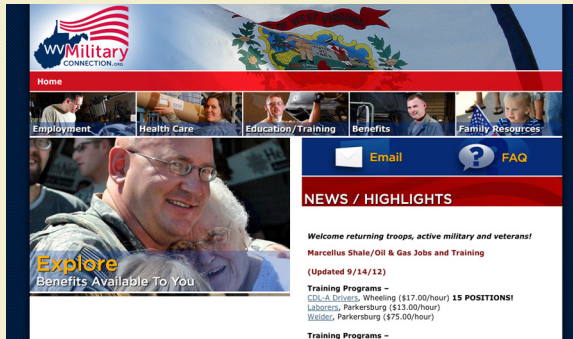

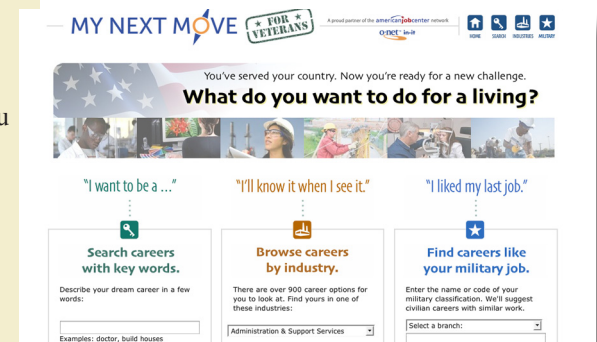

Veterans Support Organization is a vital resource in helping veterans transition from the Armed Forces to civilian life by providing employment, housing, and financial assistance.

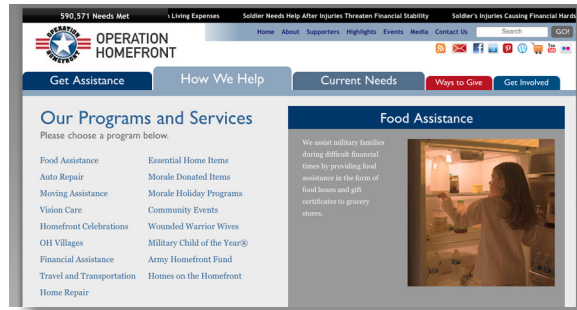

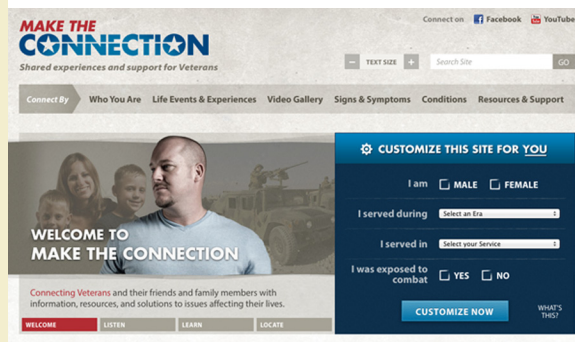

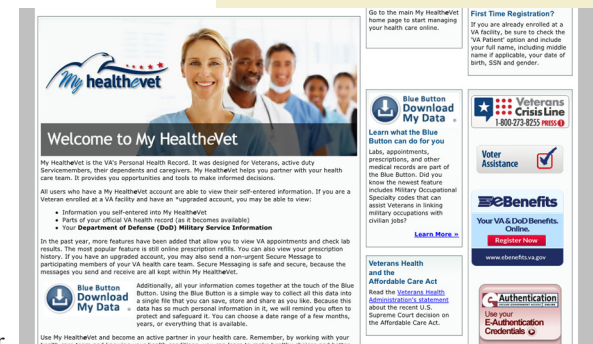

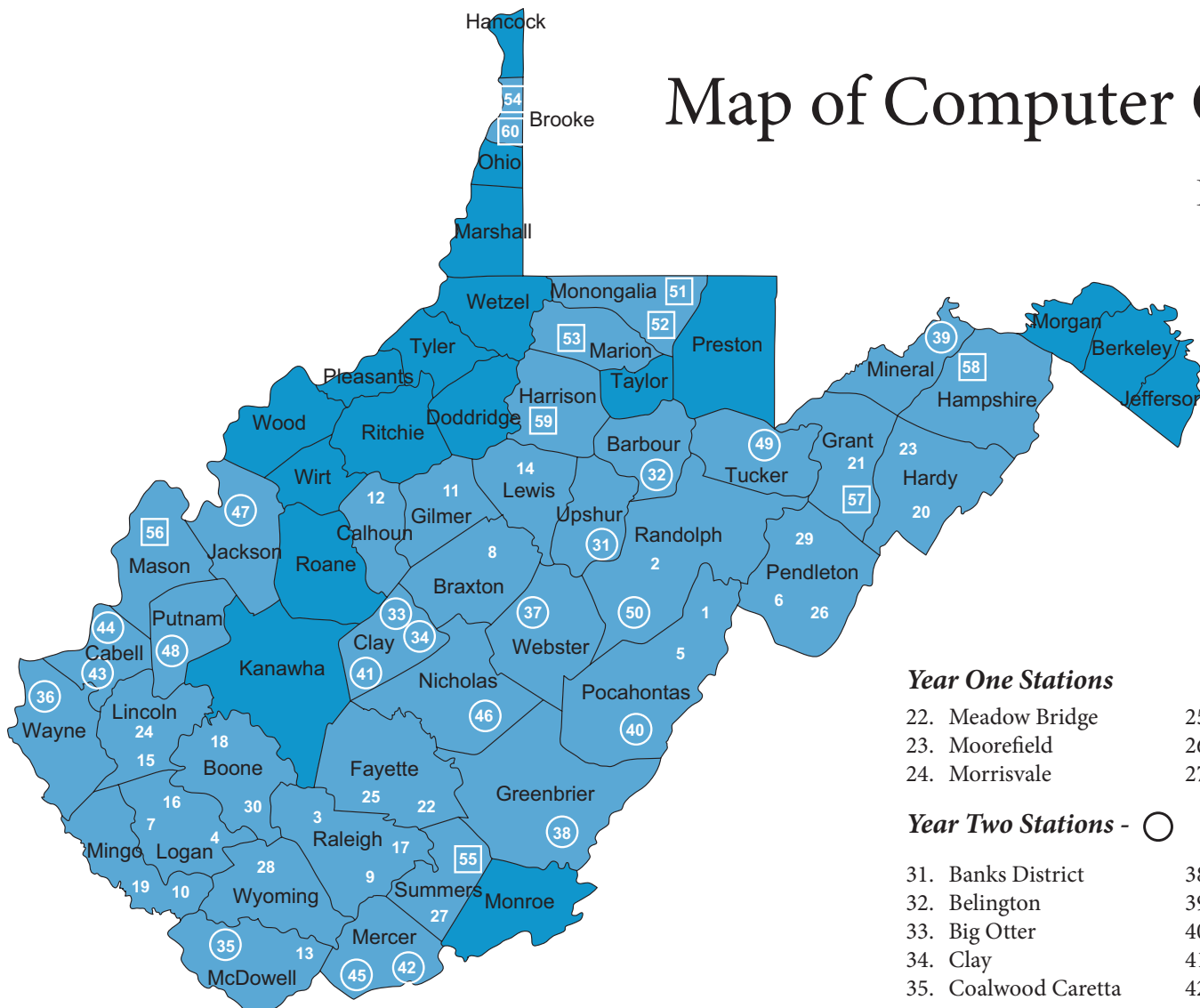
